- David Wurm Goodwill is supporting youth apprenticeship, recently launched Maine Construction Academy to Juniors and Seniors in HS as pathways to apprenticeship; hosting three cohorts this summer
- Rob Klaiber Greater Portland and Springvale CareerCenters culmination of all the work we're doing; Windham Correctional Center has growth of programs with men, getting more involved with women and veterans, etc. bringing career services to inmates
