Jeff:

- Concluded AJC apprenticeship students in York, Cumberland, and Sagadahoc Counties – worked with ~32 youth.
- Launched YouthBuild career advisor in August, supporting workforce development and career exploration at LearningWorks.
- Made connections with Boys & Girls Club and My Place Teen Center Westbrook and Biddeford locations.

Sheila:

- Working with David Watts and Joe C. with Adult Education in the region on new project to support youth; Brunswick has a good model.
- Adult Ed and Alternative Ed programs getting are back on track with Adult Ed workforce development and HiSET.
- Training a new adult career advisor (Liz); numbers keep rolling in
- Quest program is doing well. Ten work experiences right now; half will turn into fulltime employment.
- Transportation can be complicated for program participants working with transportation providers and alternatives.
- Afghan Career Pathways Grant continues to see some connections.
- A challenge is getting new hires trained and up to speed; using Maine JobLink training can be cumbersome.

Mike:

- Not a lot of collaborating right now Alex and Meghan doing a great job for DWG/Employment Recovery.
- Posting for a career advisor in Belfast, onboarding others.

Krista:

• Outreach and getting involved with local groups to get a sense of startups. All is a big topic, how it effects the future of workforce development.

Rene:

- Senior health expo in Brunswick is coming up.
- Finally making headway in coastal high schools, starting workshops about career center offers, and intends to have a hiring event after workshops.
- Working ~weekly with recovery center in Bath.

- Has a peer navigator taking over connecting with town halls, libraries
- Helping Town of Brunswick to work with ~60 immigrant families moving into new housing.
- Connecting with immigrant community through Adult Ed.

Kim:

• Finally hired a RC II councilor despite lower salary!

Rob:

- New connection with Maine Pretrial (drug court), opportunity for outreach for community-based services.
- Coordinating with Fedcap in Sanford for an event in October first collaboration with that office.
- City of Westbrook collaboration for another career fair this year might have chief of police and mayor involved.
- Collaboration with Boys & Girls Clubs in Portland and South Portland to hold job fairs.
- Lola is putting together financial literacy for hotel residents in collaboration with M&T Bank (community service commitment from FDIC).
- Work continuing at Windham correctional center.
- Lola has identified a new group being formed with Edward Kato support group working with new Mainers.
- October 4th is the next monthly event at the career center.
- Sanford has switched to every other Thursday at Adult Education.

Amy:

- Maine Outdoor Economy Summit by Maine Outdoor Brands to be held in Rockland this year November 29th – December 1st.
- OSO to judge the Roux Institute's Start Summit on Workforce Innovation, a hackathon that will be held at the UNE-Biddeford campus on October 21st.
