<p>Program Overview</p>	<p>Maine's community colleges offer nearly 300 degree and certificate options that are designed to lead to immediate employment or continued education. <p>Populations served</p>	<p>Maine's community colleges are open access institutions and seek to admit all students who meet certain minimum requirements.</p>
<p>Resources</p>	<p>Maine's community colleges offer a variety of services and resources to help students get started in college and complete their program of study. <p>Locations, Modalities</p>	<p>Maine's Community Colleges offer a range of modalities, with certain degree programs offered completely online; in-person delivery can be limited to coursework where hands-on instruction is essential to developing the skills required of the program.
